
For all of these reasons, and so many more, we have made *CELEBRATING OUR DIVERSITY* the theme for our 2019-20 program year.

From the Board

After serving 11 years as the Superintendent of the Kennett Consolidated School District back in the early 2000s, there is probably nothing I enjoy more these days than walking the halls of Kennett Middle School when After-The-Bell is in session.

Middle School students are, by definition, a very diverse group of kids. Some have gone through their adolescent growth spurts and can look this 6'1" retired superintendent right in the eye; others have to get up on their toes to be seen over the counter of the main office. Of course, in Kennett, we take particular pride in our diversity. Students come to this district from all over the world, many arriving with their families looking for the wonderful opportunities that this community provides.

As I walk past the cafeteria and down the various wings of KMS, the diversity of our happy and engaged students, along with our caring and dedicated volunteers, is a joy to behold. And the diversity I witness is not just characterized by who these students and volunteers are; it is also about what they are doing.

Students arrive in the cafeteria at 2:35 and immediately scope out the day's offerings of fresh fruit and delicious snacks. (Of course Pizza Week is their favorite!) As they head off to their activities at 3 pm, their paths diverge to a robust plethora of adventures. On any given day, about 1/3 of the students board buses to head to places like the Stroud Water Research Center, the Kennett YMCA, Coverdale Farms, and New Garden Airport for offsite activities. The rest of the students head into the classrooms, science labs, gymnasiums, outdoor fields and cooking classrooms with volunteers who cannot wait to share their experience and passion with our kids.

As I walk the halls, I can smell some tantalizing aromas coming out of our *International Cooking* activity. In the 6th Grade Wing, I poke my head into a classroom to watch students building bird houses in one room, playing Chess in another, and getting one-on-one help with their homework in still another. As I step outside in the front of the building, I see an emergency vehicle from Avondale Fire & Rescue, with EMTs demonstrating the proper use of life-saving equipment to our students. Off in the distance, large groups of boys and girls can be seen chasing a soccer ball. And around the back of the building, there are three miniature horses from our *4-H Pony Partners* activity, surrounded by students who are learning to care for them.

This year, our theme is CELEBRATING OUR DIVERSITY. We clearly have a lot to celebrate... our students, our volunteers, our community partners, and our activities. But there is still one more. We celebrate the extraordinary diversity of those who support After-The-Bell. From foundations, to businesses, to individuals, the wide-ranging and, yes, *diverse* support we receive has been the key to our success for 21 years, and counting!
