Our Mission: After-The-Bell provides a supervised after-school program of recreational, social and academic skill-developing activities for Kennett Middle School students. The program is led by community volunteers and provided without charge.

After-The-Bell is an after-school program for students in the Kennett Middle School. The Kennett After-School Association sponsors After-The-Bell to provide an enjoyable learning experience in a safe environment. After-The-Bell is open to all students of the Kennett Middle School and is free of charge, voluntary, and subject to the availability of space and facilities. After-The-Bell does not discriminate in its educational programs, activities, or employment practices, based on race, color, sex, sexual orientation, disability, age, religion, ancestry, union membership, or any other legally protected classification.

After-The-Bell is offered in three six-week programs during the school year – Fall, Winter, and Spring - on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from **2:35 pm to 5:00 pm**. Transportation home is provided. Participants receive a healthy snack and relax in the cafeteria before starting the first session at 3:00 pm. Each activity is 1 to 2 hours, depending upon the nature of the activity. If school is canceled or there is an early dismissal, After-The-Bell will not meet.

How to register

- Registration is limited, and many activities will fill the first day of registration.
- Students may register for one, two, or three days.
- For each day that they are registered, students must select activities for the first and second sessions or a double session.
 - **Students**, please return a completed Registration Form, **with parent signature**, to the After-The-Bell table outside the CAFETERIA or register at <https://www.afterthebell.org/how-to-register> no earlier than 7:15 am **Wednesday, September 13th**, and no later than 3:00 pm on **Wednesday, September 20th, 2023**
- **Parents**, please make sure you **sign** the Registration Form; registration will not be accepted without the Parent/Guardian's signature.
- If you turned in a Registration Form and did not receive an assignment letter (given out in homerooms) by **September 22nd**, check the activity assignment posters which will be posted outside the Cafeteria. If your name is not on the list, please see Ms. Paola Rosas in C106.

Rights and Responsibilities

- A student should take the appropriate time to learn about the activities and **should remain in the same activities for the program**.
- We try to give students their first choice of activity but maintain the flexibility to choose from their 2nd or 3rd choice if necessary.
- When you receive the letter informing you of the activities assigned, please notify us immediately if your child does not intend to participate. We always have students on a waiting list for all of the fun activities.
- **Students must follow the After-The-Bell Code of Conduct** (attached) at all times to be able to remain in After-The-Bell.
- Any student attending After-The-Bell may request Bus Transportation home at no charge. Students must follow our Code of Conduct while riding on the bus. **Bus service is provided by After-The-Bell, not the Kennett Consolidated School District.**
- Students who are registered for After-The-Bell on a given day must attend their After-The-Bell activities; students may not leave their activities to attend school sports games.
- Some activities are very popular. Therefore, if you sign up for a particular activity as your first choice more than once during a program, even if your application is received early, you may be scheduled for that activity only once. For example, if Arts & Crafts/Cooking is your first choice on both Tuesday and Thursday, you may be scheduled for Arts & Crafts/Cooking on only one of those days.
- After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide the scheduled activities. After-The-Bell will provide an alternative if an activity is canceled due to weather, facilitator absence, etc.

After-The-Bell Code of Conduct

Safety • Respect • Self-Discipline

Upon registering for After-The-Bell, all students and parents agree to this **Code of Conduct**. The Code of Conduct defines how all students must behave to attend After-The-Bell activities. These rules apply for all hours. They apply to all locations, at the Middle School, at off-site activities, and on any bus.

All students must behave safely and with respect for themselves all volunteers, staff, and other students. Students and volunteers will follow KMS mask guidelines.

At the beginning of each program, the staff will meet with the students to set the expectations for proper behavior - to listen to and follow instructions from the facilitators and staff, to speak only in a respectful manner, and to follow all school rules.

The cornerstones of our code of conduct are safety, respect, and self-discipline. We promote safety, show respect, and learn self-discipline through:

1) our language and 2) our actions toward others.

The first time a student misbehaves, his/her parents may be contacted and he/she may be **dismissed from the program immediately**. The staff of After-The-Bell will determine the decision to allow the student to return during the current program or to any future program. Staff may also decide the student must participate in different activities geared toward promoting proper behavior. If these changes in activities are not acceptable to the student or parents, the child always has the option of withdrawing from the current program.

The following are examples of behaviors that will cause students to be dismissed from After-The-Bell *immediately!*

- Inappropriate behavior such as lying, bullying, bad language, swearing, threats, name-calling, or any language which could cause emotional injury to students, staff, or volunteers
- Inappropriate actions which may cause injury to people or property including insulting gestures, throwing objects at others, pushing, fighting, stealing, and destroying property
- Showing disrespect by ignoring, disobeying, talking back, or being sarcastic to volunteers or staff
- Disruptive behavior in the cafeteria, the halls, the activities, or on the bus, which may include continuing to talk when asked to quiet down, continuous and intentional interruption of a volunteer, a member of the staff, or another student
- Being disrespectful of school property, such as touching the teacher's desk, SmartBoards, whiteboard, books, displays, or equipment.
- Use of cell phones, iPads, and Earphones. Earbuds, iBooks/Kindles/other electronic readers may be allowed during certain times/activities. However, ATB is not responsible in the case of a mishap or loss of this property.

By signing the Registration Form, both student and parent are stating the following:

I understand that After-The-Bell is a completely voluntary and free after-school program that is provided by volunteers and community donations. I may choose at any time to remove my child from the program. My child is expected to behave safely and respectfully when attending After-The-Bell. If my child breaks any rules, I will be contacted by the staff. I understand that my child may then be dismissed from his/her choice of activity and/or the entire program year for misbehavior. Let's have a wonderful time at After-The-Bell!

What makes us tick?

The Kennett After-School Association (KASA) was founded in 1999 by a group of citizens acting in partnership with the United Way of Chester County and the Kennett Church of the Advent to meet the needs of our Kennett Middle School children. The program has grown considerably, but is still run by just one full-time staff member. The Kennett School District partners with KASA to provide facilities for After-The-Bell in our beautiful Kennett Middle School.

Our middle school students are a diverse and enthusiastic group who need a safe environment to help them develop mature interests and a strong sense of self. Participation in the array of activities provided three times each year offer many opportunities to build life skills in a nurturing after-school environment.

Close to 200 volunteers, including retired and active teachers, parents, local professionals, senior citizens, as well as high school and college students from Kennett and the surrounding area, share their time and interests with students. Volunteers lead or assist in activities, contact other volunteers and create new activities, distribute snacks, accompany students to offsite activities, and often mentor students along the way. We need you!

Community financial support comes from the United Way, foundations, commerce and industry, and public contributions. We neither receive nor seek any tax payer money to run After-The-Bell.

As you can see, we depend heavily on the generous support of the Kennett Community and YOU, our parents, through your volunteering, donations, and enthusiastic support!

After-The-Bell is Free ... But it still costs money to run.

Even though we have very low overhead and After-The-Bell is run by volunteers, it still costs nearly \$260 per student per cycle to participate in After-The-Bell. Transportation, program supplies, activity costs, insurance and staff salaries add up quickly!

We count on the generosity of the United Way, local foundations, and generous individuals to help cover our operating expenses. We are an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit and do not receive any financial support from the Kennett Consolidated School District.

AFTER-THE-BELL Activities

Fall 2023 – September 26th through November 2nd

4-H STEM Challenge- Power Protectors (Thursday) Join us to be part of a national program developed by 4-H educators from Cornell University, University of Illinois, Utah State University, and West Virginia University, Power Protectors is a collection of activities that teach students how to address real-world issues and explore careers in energy.

4-H Wild Life All Around Us (THURSDAY) Do you like to learn about wild animals? You will learn how to identify, track, manage, and protect the wildlife that share the environment with us. Learn the basics of wildlife management and be introduced to a variety of careers!

Art with Mrs. Uhl- Ceramics (WEDNESDAY) It's time to play with clay! Students will learn basic pottery techniques for hand-building and glazing while also learning to throw on a pottery wheel.

Art with Mrs. Uhl- Altered Book Art with Alcohol Markers and Paint (WEDNESDAY) An altered book artist takes a book (old, new, recycled or multiple) and modifies it in various ways, such as cutting, tearing, folding, or embedding objects. Altered books may be as simple as adding a drawing or text to a page, or as complex as creating an intricate book sculpture.

Bake Shop (THURSDAY) Do you love to bake? We'll set up and run a company to bake and sell cookies, cupcakes, and other treats! They're so much fun to make, sell and eat. Learn the basics of running a baking business!

Board Games (ALL DAYS) Checkers, Battleship, The Game of Life, Risk, UNO, Monopoly, Connect4 & so many others. Make new friends while playing your favorite board games.

Brain Base (ALL DAYS) Do you need some extra time to get your homework finished or want to finish early? Do you sometimes need help with studying and projects? Catch up or get ahead on your studies. Go online to see your homework assignments, check your grades, or see how far you have come!

Chess Club (THURSDAY) ATB Chess Club is great for Beginners thru Masters. Learn how the pieces move, common tactics, and how to outmaneuver and out-think your opponent. Use your queen to wreak havoc on your opponent and ultimately force their King to surrender!

Comic Book Club (THURSDAY) Create the characters, tell the story, and draw the pictures for your very own comic adventure. You do it all in this program. Enter the world of Marvel/DC and have fun learning what it takes to create the next Spiderman or Incredible Hulk

Cops/1st Responders! (WEDNESDAY) Sirens screaming! Lights flashing! What is it like to be a police officer, EMT or Firefighter? Have fun and learn from a police officer and our local fire company.

Day of the Dead/Die de los Muertos (TUESDAY) Come learn about the Day of the Dead/ Dia de Muertos- a Mexican cultural tradition that honors ancestry and lost loved ones during an annual celebration. You will create beautiful art pieces and decorations and that will be displayed during Casa Guanajuato's annual Dia de los Muertos celebration at the Kennett Library.

Drama Improv Club (THURSDAY) Have you ever wanted to be an actor? Do you have trouble with speaking in front of people or maybe even just raising your hand in class? Or maybe you are already a theater buff and just want to get the opportunity to show off your skills? Drama improvisation will teach you acting and public speaking skills without having to remember any lines. You just make it up as you go! We will learn, play games, practice speaking in front of people, be goofy, and most importantly, have fun!

Dungeons and Dragons Campaign – Tyranny of Dragons (TUESDAY) Beginner adventurers are needed to bring this storytelling adventure to life. We will use our imaginations to make daring choices while we explore fantastic realms to save the Sword Coast. All activities reinforce language arts, problem-solving, and interpersonal skills.

Engineering-CAD and 3D Printing (WEDNESDAY) Students learn the basics of 3-D modeling using Tinker CAD. They have the chance to design custom figurines and other 3-D models from their imaginations. Students receive a printed version of their 3-D masterpieces.

Friends Home (WEDNESDAY) Do you like serving others? You will be traveling to Friends Home in town to spend time, play board games, and make crafts with their residents. You'll have fun and make new friends!

Fishing (WEDNESDAY) Travel to *Anson Nixon Park* to try out your fishing skills. We will learn about equipment, casting styles, the patterns of the fish, and more. Fishing poles and all equipment are provided! Please wear appropriate outdoor clothes.

Floral Design (TUESDAY) Join the 4 Seasons Gardening Club in this creative introduction to Floral Design. Join us to make your own beautiful & joyful floral masterpieces. If you have taken this before – you are welcome to take it again.

Girls Who Code (WEDNESDAY) Join STEM teacher Mrs. Bonacquisti in building coding skills and community as you create a computer science impact project. You can join this club for one hour or for both hours.

Ink Painting (TUESDAY) Join us! Ink is a medium that will connect you with an ancient technique dating back to the Han Dynasty of China. Explore sketching using a variety of ink densities that change the color of the ink using water, the variety of line thickness depending on the pressure applied to the brush, and the freestyle or precision you can decide when creating art with ink!

International Cooking (WEDNESDAY) Travel the world through food, and surprise your family and friends with your new cooking skills! Cook international dishes and maybe you'll find a new favorite of your own! Bon appetit!

Jewelry Design (TUESDAY) Learn to make unique and beautiful jewelry to keep or give as a gift. Create your beautiful earrings, rings & bracelets! Have fun! Be creative

Kennett Library (THURSDAY) Travel to the new Kennett Library and explore the new building, play in the Maker's Space, apply for your own library card and learn about all the new cool programs they are offering.

LEGO Robotics (THURSDAY) Join us to learn how to program a vehicle (built with Lego Mindstorms) that can move through a course all by itself! Learn how to use different sensors to program your robot. No previous experience is necessary because the program we use is easy to understand and is lots of fun to use.

LGBTQ+ Alliance Club (WEDNESDAY) Welcomes all students to a supportive, safe, and welcoming environment that encourages you to advocate for yourself and/or your LGBTQ+ friends. Your leadership and creative skills will be put to use as we discuss ideas to increase LGBTQ+ awareness and inclusivity within the school and the local community. In addition, this club will periodically host LGBTQ+ guest speakers to inspire and share their life and leadership experiences.

Loom Knitting (WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY) Use our round looms and colorful yarns for knitting made easy. Make a hat, scarf, and other fun crafts to take home or share with friends and family!

Pet Portrait Painting (THURSDAY) Have fun learning how to paint your pet! Show your creative side! Have fun making a beautiful keepsake with step-by-step instructions from a wonderful local artist! Make sure you bring a photo of your pet.

Tips for a Successful After-The-Bell Registration

- Registration is on a **first-come-first-served basis**. **Incomplete registration forms may not be processed**, causing students to miss the opportunity to be included in their desired classes. Activities fill quickly.
- Please complete all parts of the form including the student information page, the activity selection page, and the medical information page (please note ATB does not have access to school medical records). Registration forms must be signed by the parents/guardians and the student. **Students will not be accepted into the After-The-Bell without a parent/guardian signature on the Registration Form.**
- Students may register for one, two, or all three days of a program. **Students must select two activities each day from 3-4:00 pm and 4-5:00 pm OR a double session from 3-5:00 pm.** Students must participate in the entire program from 3:00-5:00 pm on any day they attend After-The-Bell.
- Students must list their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices for activities.** After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide students with their first choice of activity. However, due to the volume of students involved in After-The-Bell, that is not always possible.
- Be sure to **match the days you want to come with the activities available that day**. Example: If Tasty Bites is offered on Tuesday, do not put it in a Thursday slot. Review the **At a Glance** page.

- If choosing a **double session**, write the activity name across both lines. Double sessions run for 2 hours (3 – 5:00 pm).
